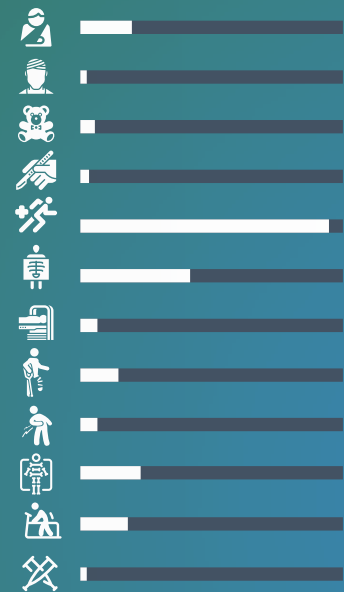
Thank you once again to all those who supported us this past year and we look forward to continuing our work as we strive to deliver the highest quality of life for the people of Manitoba.

John Sauder

Manitobans are very familiar with the name John Sauder, a trusted face in the media, keeping us informed about the weather and helping to keep us prepared for all kinds of weather conditions.

However, many would be surprised to learn that while always poised and professional on screen, our trusted meteorologist was dealing with significant ongoing pain for many of those years. For twenty years, he navigated life with a chronic injury before he discovered the relief available through the expert care at the Pan Am Clinic.

John and his wife Kim are an active couple who thrive in the outdoors. Their favourite activities include camping, kayaking, golf, tennis, hiking and skiing. It was during one of these outings that John suffered a dislocated shoulder while downhill skiing.

Over time, the recurring dislocation caused him frustration and pain while taking part in the activities that he enjoyed as he increasingly favoured the shoulder. He eventually reached a stage where the shoulder was dislocating multiple times per day.

While most medical advice focused on resistance exercises to strengthen the muscles and inhibit recurring incidents, they did little to relieve the pain or remedy the issue. It wasn't until he was referred to Dr. Peter MacDonald at the Pan Am Clinic, that he was quickly diagnosed and set on a surgical path to recovery.

“The recovery process took several months, but on a daily basis I was now living without pain,” says John. “And the shoulder wasn't dislocating anymore.”

“If you live an active life and you have a barrier that's keeping you from the activities that you enjoy, you should see the Pan Am Clinic,” John says. “It will give you your life back. An active lifestyle is a healthy lifestyle. I have a lot of trust in the Pan Am Clinic.”

A return to pre-injury shape has allowed John to return to his active lifestyle and get back to the hobbies that he enjoys, which also includes active participation with numerous local charities with which he is involved.

Chris Del Bosco

Ski-Cross Olympian

Chris Del Bosco had been a member of the Canadian National freestyle skiing team for ten years when he was first introduced to the Pan Am Clinic. Growing up in Vail, Colorado, he was living in Montreal when he suffered a posterior lateral meniscus tear in his knee, which created stability issues. He reached out to his surgeon in Colorado, Dr. William Sterett, who referred Chris to Dr. Peter MacDonald at the Pan Am Clinic. Though long practicing in the United States, Dr. Sterett identified the Pan Am Clinic as the best place to seek care for a top tier athlete. Chris shares that within six months of the 2017 surgery, he was back on the race roster in competition.

“It’s a whole effort between the doctor and the physiotherapists – it’s a whole team,” says Chris. “It makes a world of difference when the doctor is going above and beyond at every engagement. It takes a lot of work to get back to even 90% because of the nature of the injury and the demands of training and competition.”

While he would experience no further pain or uncertainty with his knee, he found himself back at the Pan Am Clinic again in August 2020 after suffering a torn achilles tendon during training camp. He was delighted to learn that the remedy was not a typical surgery. Instead, it was minimally invasive, left a much smaller scar, and it allowed him to return to racing within four months. He attributes this, in part, to the mechanics of the ski boot, which is as supportive as a cast and allows for little movement of the ankle.



“I like to do my research and know what’s going on. I always question why this procedure vs. another,” says Chris. “I read up on procedures and rehabilitation protocols. I’m sure that I annoy him, but Dr. MacDonald has always been patient with me and taken the time to answer all of my questions and discuss my treatment plan.”

Del Bosco’s faith in the Pan Am Clinic may be well evidenced by his repeated consultations and treatment from the Winnipeg clinic, though as an Olympian, he has access to a wide array of medical and performance specialists. And for this competitive athlete that has won six medals at the Winter X games and a gold medal at the 2011 World Freestyle ski championships, ensuring injury care that will keep him in line with the best in the sport is key.

“I have had such a good experience with Dr. MacDonald, that the Pan Am is my first ‘go to’ whenever something major comes up.”

Chris visited the clinic again this year when a collision on the ski course caused a dislocated shoulder and a torn labrum. Surgical correction also required a reattachment of the bicep. Through the care provided, Chris reports that he didn’t miss any time in the gym, though he was on a modified training program immediately following surgery. However, after only three months, he had joined his teammates for training camp in Europe as he prepares for the start of the season.

Barbara (Barb) Engel

After enduring three years of hip pain, Barb Engel did not realize how limiting her ailment was in fully enjoying life. When physiotherapy and massage failed to alleviate her pain, she began to explore a surgical approach.

“At first, I stumped them,” Barb says of the physician’s review of her x-rays. “But I wasn’t ready to say ‘I guess this is how my body is, I’ll live with the pain.’ That’s when I was first referred to the Pan Am Clinic by two separate practitioners.”

Once she connected with the team at the Pan Am Clinic, Engel says she gained confidence that a remedy could be found even from the extensive intake questionnaire before seeing a doctor.

“It was very detailed and somewhat intimate, but it really helped me to see how pain was affecting my life. This first step was a really important one in my journey.”

Initial treatment with cortisone injections relieved the daily pain, but only for short periods and it was determined that surgery may offer the best opportunity for long-term relief from pain.

“He was really honest with me,” says Barb of orthopaedic surgeon Dr. Devin Lemmex. “He painted a pretty sobering picture of what surgery and recovery would look like. So I was well prepared and also able to advocate for myself.”

Part of that self-advocacy was having a say in when the procedure would be performed to best allow her to commit to recovery. As an educator, moving her procedure from December to June ensured that she could focus on her recovery without worrying about being away from work.

She admits that the recovery period was a shock to the system for someone accustomed to walking an average of fifteen to twenty kilometers daily. But with support from family, coordinated post-surgical care from the Pan Am Clinic and her own steadfastness in her daily exercises, she was able to see steady progress.

“There was constant communication between the surgeon and my physiotherapist during recovery. They worked so closely together and their messaging was consistent – I felt like we were working as a single team, with each of us doing our part. I now consider myself pain-free for the first time in nearly six years.”





Sport & Exercise Medicine Enhanced Skills Program

Dr. Hein Peters

There is no mistaking the pride in his voice when Dr. Hein Peters talks about the Pan Am Clinic’s Sport & Exercise Medicine residency program. After all, he’s been on the team since the program was first developed and has served as the head of the program since 2014.

Born in South Africa, Dr. Peters was a multi-sport athlete in his youth. He saw his pursuit of a career in sport medicine as simply combining his own passion for sport and medicine. He came to Canada in 2000 and joined the Pan Am Clinic sport medicine team in 2004.

“When I first considered sport medicine, I realized that I was not dealing with patients who were really sick,” says Dr. Peters. “I saw the opportunity to make a difference because these were patients that were motivated to get better, and they would apply the effort required to recover.”

From the program’s inception through support of the Pan Am Clinic Foundation in 2008, it evolved in 2013 when the University of Manitoba adopted it as part of its Family Medicine residency program, adding University credentials to successful completion of the one year placement.

“Of fifteen fellows and residents who have completed the program, nine are still employed at the Pan Am Clinic,” shares Dr. Peters. “And two of those nine have ascended to leadership roles.”

Each year, the program receives between five and nine applications for the coveted residency. With applicants from across the country, their resumes and references reflect top tier candidates. The selection is tough every year, but Dr. Peters recognizes why the opportunity is so sought after.

“Our training gets done 80% at the Pan Am Clinic – all at one place, under one roof. With nineteen primary care sport medicine practitioners, students are exposed to a variety of expertise and approaches. When you add to that pediatricians, pain specialists, radiologists, surgeons, physiotherapists and the musculoskeletal acute care program, it creates one of the most complete training environments in Canada.”

Dr. Peters identifies that when considering candidates for the program, they are looking not only for applicants who have communicated an interest in sport medicine, but also those whose previous experience may identify that they stand to get the most out of the residency. “After all,” Dr. Peters reminds us, “It’s only a one year term – and that’s not a lot of time considering all that they have to learn.”

The focus of the training and its application in patient care is focused on athletes; those trying to still be athletes and those just wanting to stay mobile. Dr. Peters says that they have seen graduates of the program continue a practice in family medicine, and the Pan Am curriculum becomes a valuable skillset for that practitioner’s repertoire.

“Because our focus is on musculoskeletal medicine, which is unfortunately not a priority area in family medicine training, our work not only supports general practitioners, but it provides local expertise to Manitoba doctors who are working with a large case load. Our residents have benefitted from this added element of knowledge to pursue their own family medical practice in Manitoba and other provinces after they have studied with us, although most have pursued a full-time career in Sport & Exercise Medicine.”

Dr. Eva Gusnowski

Fellowship Program (09/2021-08/2022)
Orthopaedic Sports Medicine and Upper Extremity Reconstruction
Orthopaedic Training: Calgary, Alberta, Canada

In preparation to launch her own medical career, Dr. Eva Gusnowski had heard from her peers that the Pan Am Clinic offered a tremendous environment to pursue her fellowship in sports medicine and upper extremity surgery. In preparation, she had completed a BSc and MSc in molecular biology and genetics at the University of Alberta, medical school at the University of British Columbia and completed her orthopaedic residency at the University of Calgary. After completing a fellowship in shoulder surgery at London, Ontario’s, Western University, she arrived in Winnipeg to complete her fellowship with the Pan Am Clinic.

“Sports medicine and shoulder surgery has always been the most interesting field of orthopaedics for me,” says Eva. “I found the clinics, surgeries and patient population to be interesting areas for both doing the work itself as well as performing research around such a rapidly evolving field.”

Dr. Gusnowski was pleasantly surprised to discover that while the clinic is well known as the treatment center of choice for high-level athletes, that as a practitioner, she was able to meet and treat a wide spectrum of patients.

“Through the Pan Am Clinic, I was able to work with patients of all ages and needs. Everything from chronic pain and mobility or performance issues suffered by everyday people right up to working with professional athletes.”

Without hesitation, Dr. Gusnowski is enthusiastic in her endorsement of the Pan Am Clinic as a venue to sharpen the skills of any emerging sports medicine practitioner striving for excellence.

“There is such a wide breadth and depth of training across a wide scope of diverse training and different skills. It’s one of the best sports fellowships in the country. The calibre of people I worked with was beyond what you’ll find anywhere else,” says Dr. Gusnowski. “If anything, it over prepared me for going into independent practice.”

Since completing her Pan Am fellowship, Dr. Gusnowski is presently setting up her own practice in shoulder reconstruction and sports medicine in Saint John, New Brunswick.



Medical Careers Exploration Program (MCEP) 2021/22

The 2021/22 program year brought many new opportunities and experiences for the students in the 14th cohort of the Medical Careers Exploration Program from the Children of the Earth School.

With the pandemic still taking its toll on our medical system the decision was made to keep the program's practicum virtual again this year. However, that didn't stop the students from getting immersive and hands-on experiences and learning more about loads of different healthcare careers. Our partners were ready to take on the challenge, like the Women's Health Clinic took on this challenge by delivering a package full of supplies to the students before they met with them virtually. With this they were able to use practice arm kits to do blood draws, as well as meet with a newborn parent, medical assistants and physicians, do virtual tours and demos and so much more.

Even our Discovery Day for the program took on a new look this year. Grade 9 students from across the Winnipeg School Division got to watch an ulnar shortening osteotomy (surgery) via livestream and were able to interact with the staff involved. After the surgery, students were given a presentation about the program. This gave students the chance to learn more about the program and give them

an insider look into the types of experiences the program offers. Afterward the students were encouraged to apply to join the program next year.

The Discovery Day was a successful launch of the expansion of the program, as the 2022/23 program evolves from having students from Children of the Earth School to having students from across the entire Winnipeg School Division. The goal of this expansion is to increase our impact by reaching more students. We are already well on our way, as we have seen a record high number of students apply and be accepted into next year's program, nearly doubling our previous record.

We are so grateful to the staff and students at the Children of the Earth School, and all of our partners in the healthcare system, for their hard work and dedication to the program. We know that this year came with its challenges, but together we did it. We are looking forward to next year and all of the growth and changes the expansion of the program will bring.
